Thriving business and innovation hub

The Helsinki-Uusimaa Region is one of the fastest-growing areas in Europe and the driving force for economic growth in Finland. The region produces 39 percent of Finland's gross domestic product and has almost a third of all jobs in Finland. It is also a dynamic knowledge hub and innovation centre for the new European business and politics. Helsinki-Uusimaa Region has been selected European Entrepreneurial Region (EER) 2021–2022. The region is the first ever to receive this award for a second time.

Helsinki-Uusimaa has a strong and versatile educational sector, with large number of different schools offering a high-standard education. This is also one of the reasons why competences are a uniting factor across all strategic priorities.

Smart specialisation strategy is successful when closely connected actors innovate together based on their region's strengths.

Smart specialisation is cooperation

Therefore, regional innovation ecosystems and its actors play a central role. Helsinki-Uusimaa rose to the top of the European Union in 2019 in a comparative publication on the ability of the innovation ecosystems of European countries and regions. This is the result of determined cooperation and action and gives us a good steppingstone for implementing our smart specialisation strategy.

Helsinki Uusimaa and its' actors are actively participating in international networks and cooperation projects. By combining the strengths of different regions and transferring competence across national borders, we will be able to harness more efficiently the resources of Europe in its entirety.



Helsinki-Uusimaa's strengths are compiled under the umbrella theme resource wisdom, which means utilisising existing resources and creating growth through new resources in a way that is deliberate and economically, socially, and environmentally sustainable.
